

Signs of dyslexia

Slow to

- copy
- recall words and facts
- memorise sequences (days of the week, months, the alphabet)

Vocabulary:

- Quickly forget new words
- Bad at prefixes/suffixes/root

- need more time to read
- forget what a text was about right after reading
- confuse similar letters

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

Accommodation = change



Aim: every student has a chance to succeed





Are accommodations fair?

'Fair does not mean treating every student exactly the same.

Fair means

providing each student

with what that student needs

to have a chance to succeed.'



Classroom accommodations



examples

Perfect teacher for dyslexic students

understands their frustration

knows that their difficulties are inherited and caused by brain differences

won't make them look stupid in front of their peers



Classroom accommodations





Your classroom is a safe place for dyslexic students

If you

- DON'T force them to read out loud in class
- DON'T ask them to write on the board
- DON'T allow peer correction

Shorter homework tasks

 Unfinished classroom work shouldn't be sent home

Teaching tips

- 1. Copying from the board is difficult provide handouts
- 2. Use pictures/flashcards and mind maps
- 3. Reading: use larger fonts and wider line spaces
- Font size: 13-14 points
- 4. Vocabulary: more practice and revision (e.g. games)





Testing & assessing

• Grade content rather than spelling

- Shorter tests or extended time
- Many short quizes instead of 1 or 2 long exams
- Oral testing better
- Accept writing tasks typed on a computer






What form for a test?

Easiest:

Draw a line = match









Gap-fill with a list of possible answers



Multiple choice (too much reading)





Harder gapfill (without)

Hardest essay





How to correct spelling

If you highlight or circle the mistakes

→ students focus on the incorrect forms instead of learning the correct spelling.

THEY NEED TO SEE THE CORRECT FORM

"cross the misspelled word and write the correct spelling above or next to it. In that way it is the correct form which is made visible and, hopefully, integrated.'





How to correct spelling

'The use of the red pen only enforces incorrect spelling'
